

Parent and Student Livestream/Recorded Video Information
2021-2022 School Year

Dear Parent and Students,

The livestream/pre-recorded video option for the 2021-2022 school year is only available for the WCSC students who are listed as follows: (1.) a student who has been quarantined by the school due to having been deemed a close contact to a Covid positive person is eligible to view the livestream; and (2.) a student who has received a positive Covid-19 test result is also eligible to view the livestream. The livestream process will be similar to what was done last year, but there are a few differences to the program that are explained below.

1. Communication from the student to the teacher is extremely important if a student is quarantined or absent from school. Most issues can be resolved if the student contacts the teacher to discuss due dates and when assignments need to be turned in for a grade.
2. Students who are quarantined due to being a close contact will be able to see a livestream of their courses or a pre-recorded lesson that covers the topics the student is missing on that day. It may take up to one full school day for the teacher to be notified that a student needs access to the classroom via a livestream or pre-recorded video.
3. The Warrick County School Corporation's attendance policy is in effect for quarantine and all non-quarantine students when it comes to make-up work. Students will still be allowed time to make up their homework per the policy. Even if a student decides to view a livestream/pre-recorded video on a day they missed, they will be granted days to make up the work per the Warrick County School Corporation attendance policy. Any large projects/papers that have been assigned a due date in the teacher syllabus are still due on the day they are assigned unless permission is granted by the teacher to turn this item in when the student returns to school. 4. All tests and quizzes will be taken at school when a student returns from their quarantine or absence. Tests and quizzes will not be conducted while a student is livestreaming the course. Communicate with the teacher in order to determine the proper date that you would take the test or quiz.
5. If a student is logging into a livestream then they are expected to be in the Google Meet a few minutes before the class period starts. Students are not allowed to logout before the livestream is ended by the teacher. Logging out ahead of time may result in disciplinary action.
6. Students will not be allowed to livestream a course if they are in a vehicle or in a location that is not conducive to learning unless the student has obtained permission from the administration to do so.

7. All school rules are in effect if a student is viewing the class in a livestream. Any student causing a disruption will be assigned discipline by the teacher and/or the principal's office.
8. When a student is in the livestream of a classroom they will only be able to see the board or teacher's desktop screen.
9. All assignments must be submitted to the teacher in the manner that the teacher has requested (Email, Google Classroom, etc.). Any student that does not submit an assignment by the deadline that is set by the teacher or determined by the attendance policy will be marked absent from the class period the assignment was due.
10. High school students taking an AP or Dual Credit course may be required to view the livestream in real time if requested. The only exception to this would be if the student is ill. Students will need to check with their AP or Dual Credit teachers.

Please understand that a majority of the students will be in the classroom and as such, continual interaction with the livestreaming student may be limited. If a student has any questions then they can enter them in the chat (if available) or email the teacher directly.
